Gabrielle Kanter: <i>Book Making</i>	•	•			•	•	•	Make extraordinary books out of ordinary materials. Styles include accordion, pop-up, wearable books and journals. Books can be used to hold students' poetry, short stories and art work.
Gabrielle Kanter: <i>Holiday Gift Making</i>	•	•			•	•		Students are guided through creating unique handmade gifts such as birdhouses, notepads, reverse- glass painting and more. Great for the holidays, Mother's Day, Father's Day, fundraisers and more!
