- We attended the NJ School Boards Association Conference and had a table in the STEAM "Command Center" with our teaching artist Ben Pranger.

- At the National Dance Education Organization (NDEO) Conference in San Antonio, TX on Nov 11, teaching artist Laura Marchese will be presenting about the Dance to Learn curriculum and program which reaches students in grades 2-5.

# **Behind the Scenes:**

- ChipandGus was a terrific night in support of YA! Thank you Liz Fillo and Chris Coucill for your generosity and thank you to Ann Betterton who took care of every detail to make it a welcoming and beautiful evening.
- Our work in the Branding and Marketing Project, with Oxford Communications, is in the research phase. We hosted a "Discovery Day" on October 25<sup>th</sup> where 20+ YA stakeholders including artists, educators, PTA representatives, trustees, staff and donors discussed the value

of YA programming and how we can emphasize our strengths. Additionally, two distinct surveys are being sent: one to our donor base and one to our school contacts.

- The Impact 100 Garden State finalists have been publicly announced. On November 8<sup>th</sup>, each finalist has exactly 6 minutes to make a presentation to the membership about their project. The members vote that night and winners are announced that evening. I'll be attending and our **amazing** trustee Eleanor Horne is making our presentation—we could not be any more appreciative of her commitment, her time and her incredible talent. Go Eleanor!
- At the YA National Leadership Conference, the ED Council (comprised of every affiliates' Exec Director or President) voted to continue supporting the national Teaching Artist Credential project. YA National is funding this project as well, and participating affiliates are dedicating staff time to the effort. During this pilot year we hope to credential 12-25 artists from affiliates around the country, while creating a strategy for sustaining this initiative.
