At the public meeting of the New Jersey State Council on the Arts (NJSCA), Arts Education Committee Chair Gary Blackman will highlight Young Audiences professional development programs during his report. A YA teaching artist who many of you know and love, Laura Marchese, will be in attendance and get a "shout out" from Gary. We're thrilled! The meeting is open to the public: Tuesday December 5, 12:00, Two River Theatre, 21 Bridge Ave, Red Bank, NJ 07701. I'll be attending and leaving from YA @ 10:30 if you'd like to join me.

In the Field:

During the month of November, our artists completed over 300 programs in schools. That's in a month where schools are closed 4-7 days! Know that everything you do as Trustees helps make it possible for us to bring children these valuable experiences:

- 73 performances including programs that celebrated Native American history and culture, address bullying and address science and math concepts.
- 27 professional Development sessions, mostly in Paterson, as part of the Creativity Consultant Project, helping teachers use arts integration strategies.
- Over 200 hands-on workshops ranging from Afro Cuban Percussion to Graphic Novels, to Latin Dance to Theatre to Learn and AIE long-term residencies in the visual arts.

Kudos as always to our Programming Staff, Donna and Carol and our Education Staff, Liz, Michelle Marigliano and Jackie who make it all happen.

Behind the Scenes:

• Great news! Today we received an unexpected \$25,000 grant from the Burke Foundation for our general operating support. While they undergo their own strategic planning, we are grateful for their generosity.

 On November 8th Eleanor made a brilliant presentation to the 200+ members of Impact 100 Garden State, to pitch our project United We Create. I couldn't be more proud of her and the team (lead by Ann) of Alexa, Liz and Queen Nur who worked on this so beautifully. The project's goal is to increase understanding and empathy between non-Muslims and Muslims, to reduce bullying and negative effects of isolation and stereotypes which are prevalent for Muslim schoolchildren. Unfortunately we were not selected to receive a grant. We are however, making the most of the opportunity and have already received an unsolicited donation from an Impact 100 member who thought we should have won. Silver linings! And, most importantly we continue to seek funding for this critically important program.

45th Anniversary Campaign Update:

 Total raised: \$165,000 of the \$450,000 goal from 7 donors.
